- The above fees are per applicant only.
- The agreed fee will depend on the complexity of the matter and the amount of casework involved, such as the amount of supporting evidence we need to consider and the status of the application ie whether it is an initial application, extension or settlement application. We will be able to provide you with a more accurate estimate once we obtain more information relating to your case.

- Services included within the fee :
 - Discussing your circumstances in detail and attending on you
 - Taking instructions and providing advice
 - Considering supporting documents
 - Preparing and submitting the application on your behalf
 - Advising on timelines and the outcome of the application
 - Dealing with Home Office until a decision is made

- Services **NOT** included within the fee:
 - Advice we provide you with appeals, administrative reviews or judicial review where your application has been refused.
 - Disbursements which are payable to third parties such as Home Office fees. You will have to pay these directly to the Home Office.
 - Interpreter fees, if a professional interpreter is required in your case. You do not always have to use an interpreter of our choosing, often you can bring a friend or another community figure to come and help interpret.
 - Translation fees, if there are documents not in English which needs translating.
 - Barrister fees, where we require the advice or an opinion of a barrister in relation to your case.
 - Other professional service providers- This could include business plan writers, accountants, property surveyors or independent experts.

- We cannot guarantee how long the Home Office will take to process your application, although we will inform you the time estimate as indicated in the Home Office's guidance.

- For some applications the Home Office offers fast track services (at an extra cost), where you can request to expedite the visa processing times.
